School to Katoomba

Bald Hill Mine

Bald Hill Mine is near the centre of Hill End. We walked though the mine and climbed the ventilation shaft. The ladders were steep and the shaft was narrow. They found no gold in the mine at all.

Town Walk

When we were doing the town walk we had a quiz about the town and the groups that won were 'da boys' and 'team Google' and our prize was a little bit of flake gold.

Hawkins Hill

This is the lookout at the end of the town. You can see the Turin River and the path of the Macquarie River. Hawkins Hill was the place where the richest known deposit of gold was ever found. The Holtermann Specimen was found there.


