In last Sunday's Gospel reading we were set a task that challenges many of us. ### **Snake Warning**

As the weather warms up there is an increased chance that snakes may be sighted along the boundary of the school and in the school grounds. Whilst no snakes have, as yet, entered into the playground or classroom areas it is timely to remind the children of safety around snakes. This is especially important as when we return to school at a prime time for snakes to become more active. Included is the procedure that we have in place to manage this eventuality.

In the event of a snake being sighted in or near School buildings or the playground the school Office should be notified and children who would be at risk will be moved to a safe area. With one adult watching the snake's movements another adult should close (but not lock) doors and windows to contain the snake to a defined area.

At no time is any person from the school (students, staff, parent or visitor) to attempt to handle the snake.
