Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Yesterday we gathered as a school to observe with respect Remembrance Day. Remembrance Day marks the anniversary of the armistice, which ended the First World War (1914–18). During the prayer, I had a moment of reflection about my time in Gallipoli during my pilgrimage experience in 2014. The quiet respectful reverence that the students display during our prayer and liturgy celebrations and this prayer celebration reminded me of the quiet, reverent stillness I experienced on the Gallipoli Peninsula. The sense of reverence was heightened during the minute silence and then the singing of the national anthem. This was a truly reflective prayer celebration with the students leading through their participation.

Continuing the theme of sacrifice, Sunday's Gospel recalled the sacrifice and generosity of the widow who gave all she had. At one level this is a story of generosity and giving to support others. However on another level it is also a reflection about our devotion to our faith. The woman gave all she had such was the level of her trust and belief in the providence of God.

At this time of year we call on the abundant generosity of our community to support St Vincent de Paul and their work at Christmas. In the next week each child will bring home a suggestion for an item to contribute to class hampers. These hampers will be donated to our local St Vincent de Paul to be distributed to those in our local community who are in need. We thank all families in advance for your generosity.

Reports

Teachers are currently in the process of writing the end of year report for all children. A great deal of time and effort goes into constructing the reports for each student, with teachers working to give you the most accurate assessment of your child's progress and achievement as is possible. Reports will be sent home in Week 10 of this term.



Class Placements

Teachers use a very thorough and thoughtful process of discernment when forming new class groups for the following year. They use a range of information gathered throughout the year to place each student into the best possible environment for their learning. Whilst most parents are very happy to entrust teachers with the placement of children there are instances where specific educational or pastoral needs should be considered during this process. I invite parents who have such a specific consideration to inform me of your particular needs so that they can be included in discussions when classes are formed. All positive and constructive requests will be carefully considered but **no absolute guarantees can be given**. I would ask that all considerations be forwarded to me by Friday 20th November. Parents who have already raised and discussed maters related to student progress, learning needs and placement for 2016 with staff during this year can be assured that this information will be considered during the placement process.

Children not returning in 2016

Thank you to the two families who indicated that they will be moving away from HFS at the end of this. If there are families who are not returning to Holy Family School in 2016, it is important to inform to the school, in writing, about your intention. To be compliant, we are required to notify which school the children will be attending in 2016. Your notification to us assists with the organisation of class and homeroom groupings for next year. It also assists us with enrolment enquiries that we are receiving for 2016.

Mathematics Assessment Interviews (MAIs) Day 1 & 2 of 2016

Earlier this week a letter was sent home regarding the beginning of the 2016 school year. The first two days, $27^{th}/28^{th}$ January 2016, staff will be conducting assessments in support of our EMU mathematics work. This arrangement will allow staff to gather essential data as early in the year as possible. This data will be used by teachers to develop targeted teaching programs to support the individual learning needs of the students. The assessments will be for all students from Kinder to Year 6. We are in the process of setting up the online booking service to arrange these interviews. Information will be coming out very soon which will assist parents to book times for interviews on these days. The first day for all students will be Friday 28^{th} January.

Staffing

Mrs Bray and Miss Bunting have informed me that they will not be returning to teach at Holy Family School in 2016. After 7 years Mrs Bray will be leaving Holy Family School to take up a position as a lead teacher at St Nicholas of Myra, Penrith. After two and half years Miss Bunting has informed me that she is looking to explore other options for her teaching beyond HFS. We thank Mrs Bray and Miss Bunting for their work at HFS and wish them well in pursuing new opportunities. There will be an opportunity to farewell both Mrs Bray and Miss Bunting at the end of year mass. The process of finding replacements for Mrs. Bray and Miss Bunting has begun and will be finalised in the near future.

Christmas Celebration

This year we will hold our annual Christmas celebration on Thursday 10th December. We will, weather permitting, stage the celebration on the oval area and utilise the outdoor area for the performance items. In the event that weather does not permit the use of the outdoor venue we will use the Church. All students will be involved in the preparation and performance of the items for this celebration. We encourage all families to support this whole school event by your presence and participation in this whole school celebration. Further details will be shared very shortly.




AFL Auskick Clinic
