The pilgrimage was a wonderful, unique opportunity for which I will always be thankful. Over the next few weeks I will be visiting classrooms sharing some of the beautiful encounters I had during this journey. It is through my new understandings and insights into our faith that I will share my experiences.

Unfortunately, Anthony incurred an injury during his leave and has had to take some extended sick leave. I will therefore continue in the Acting Principal role and Mrs Karen Ryan will be the Acting Assistant Principal during this time. Anthony is continuing to recover and thanks you in advance for your thoughts and prayers.

On Monday and Tuesday of this week myself, Mrs Rosa Surace and Mrs Wendy Stewart had a professional learning opportunity about our PBS4L framework with Dr Tim Lewis. As we continue to develop our school's unique framework it is important to remember three key messages for our parents and caregivers as this is an essential part of the framework's success in our school and the next steps in our journey.

The key messages are;

Adults matter:

Adults matter when children are being asked to behave in a safe, consistent and respectful way. Your positive relationship with the school is an essential element of this message. Critical to the success of PBS4L is having everyone on board. As parent/carer you model the behaviour you expect from the children. Do not underestimate the importance of:

- Role modelling appropriate behaviour
- Supporting, by following the systems, procedures and processes of the school eg: arriving at school on time, supporting your child to be ready for learning, following personalised plans (academic and behavioural)
- Following the appropriate communication channels of the school
- Appropriate reactions to behaviour particularly when your child might 'get it wrong'
- Promoting a 'growth' mindset in your child mistakes are an opportunity to grow and learn.

At Holy Family we are:

- Safe
- Respectful
- Responsible
- Learners



Behaviour is learnt:

Explicit teaching of expected behaviours is a key component of PBS4L. The school has developed a range of expected behaviours in non-classroom settings This takes the form of a matrix that indicates simple and clear context specific behaviour expectations that are aligned to the school rules. The teaching of these behaviour expectations in a positive way allows for consistency across the school environment. As parent/carer you create the conditions for appropriate behaviour. Do not underestimate the importance of:

- Asking your child questions that will elicit a positive response regarding their day at school (see below)
- Being familiar with the expectations of the school and classroom
- Teaching your child your own expectations at home eg: appropriate manners, greetings etc.

Examples of Questions to ask your child about their school day:

- What was your favourite part about school today?
- Tell me one new thing you learned at school today and I'll tell you one thing I learned at work/home.
- Who or what made you laugh today?
- What's your favourite thing about your teacher?
- What project are you working on in Art/English/Mathematics?
- What skills are you working on in PE/Sport?
- What book(s) did you read today? Tell me a little bit about the characters.
- What does your teacher have planned this week/next week/tomorrow?
- What are you looking forward to at school tomorrow?
- What has been your most favourite activity this year (ask this at various points throughout the year)?

We cannot make the students behave.

Humans need systems to function in an orderly way. As adults, we interact and encounter many systems every day in order to function positively in society. A school environment is no different. Systems must be put in place consistently across the school environment for all students to experience success at school. So, effective and positive systems and environments matter. As parent/carer your modeling of adhering to systems and environmental expectations enables your child to interact positively within the school and classroom context. Do not underestimate the importance of:

- Following school procedures eg: adhering to parent/school communication procedure, regular reading of the school newsletter
- Not becoming involved in playground incidents but rather alerting a staff member to your concern.

We will be providing more specific communication regarding the next part of our PBS4L journey for 2019 and how parents/carers can support the school in sending a consistent message to the students of Holy Family.

May we once again be ever thankful for our strengths as a community and the opportunities presented to us each day. It is through our faith and strength as a community that our students can continue to learn and grow to their full potential.

School Attendance


Year 6 Graduation Bears & Balls

Parramatta Diocese 2019 Information For Parents of current Year 4

and Year 5 students - Registration window open only for Basketball & Tennis ONLY

Dear Parents.

Parramatta Diocesan Primary students enrolled in Year 5 and 6 in 2019 are invited to participate in the Parramatta Diocesan Team Sport Trials during Term Four in 2018 and Term One in 2019. It is important to note that these trials are generally for those children who display an above average ability and/or have representative experience in their chosen sport. While teams are open in age it is **strongly recommended that only children of a representative standard in years 5 & 6 in 2018 be invited to attend.** To facilitate this, Parramatta Diocesan trials will be held in the following sports:

To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au ~ Click on "REP SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "INFORMATION & REGISTRATION PROCESS". Each sport has a different registration criteria.

This online form is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST** for the 2019 Parramatta Diocesan Primary Sport Team trials. You may complete this form to attend a selection trial or if you have been selected in a representative squad or team. One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport and when completed, click SUBMIT.

Please note that your online registration is an **EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY** and **MUST be approved by your child's school**. In order for your child to attend the nominated trial or event this may come down to the discretion of your school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports only 2 students per school can be nominated. **Please complete all fields and especially "Representative Experience"**.

Your child's school will notify you one week prior to the trial date if your child is to attend to the Parramatta Diocesan trial for their selected sport by providing a trial information sheet.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.

\$8.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for after school trials & \$10.00 trialling fee is payable on the day for half day and full day trials.

This is to be paid upon registration at the trials once your child has been approved to attend the Parramatta Diocesan Trials.

Please note that the full day trials will be for boys cricket, boys soccer, boys rugby league & boys rugby union.

Due to the popularity of boys cricket, boys soccer and girls netball a maximum of 2 children only are eligible to trial from each school. Selection of the 2 boys and girls will be made jointly by the school sport coordinator and principal.

Half day trial for tennis and netball... all other trials will be held after school beginning at 4pm.

MACKILLOP TRIAL

It should be noted that the main purpose of the Mackillop trial is to select a team to compete at the NSW PSSA Championships. The Inter-Diocesan MacKillop Trial is not a competition although a round robin format is often used to facilitate the selection procedure.

NSW PSSA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Children who are successful at being selected in the Mackillop team will compete at the NSWPSSA Championships. These championships involve three or four days of competition at various locations in NSW. Children selected in these teams may also be required to attend training sessions. At the NSW PSSA Championships a State team will be selected to participate at the School Sport Australia Inter State Exchange for some sports.

SCHOOL SPORT AUSTRALIA

To be considered for selction in the NSWPSSA state team for participation at all School Sport Australia 12 Years & Under championships: Students mus be turning between the ages of 10 and 12 in the year of competition i.e. Students turning the ages of 8, 9 and 13 in the year of competition are not eligible for NSWPSSA State selection. The School Sport Australia Championships are held over numerous days that may include weekdend.

Please note the following information:

- The Diocesan trials, MacKillop trials and NSWPSSA Championships are held on school days.
- Parents are responsible for all transport and supervision arrangements and must remain to supervise their child at the trial at all times.
- Children need to generally be of representative standard.
- Attendance at training days, where applicable is compulsory.
- The selector's decisions are final.
- Parents will need to make their own travel arrangements for children representing Parramatta at Inter-Diocesan MacKillop trials. This may mean travel to Sydney, Wollongong, Canberra, Wagga or Forbes.
- Please be aware that the teacher conducting the trial and accompanying the team to the venue is a "Team Manager" ~ not a coach.

If you would like your child to participate in one of the Parramatta Diocesan trials please complete the Team Online Registration Form that can be accessed via the website www.primarysportparra.catholic.edu.au ~ Click on "REPRESENTATIVE SELECTIONS" tab and scroll down to the SPORT you wish to register for and click on the "REGISTER" button below the heading "INFORMATION & REGISTRATION PROCESS".

2019 Basketball & Tennis NOMINATIONS close Wednesday 31st October 2018

All other sports will open on Monday 19th November and close Friday 1st February 2019.


